

The easiest tastiest BBQ steak recipe ever!!

Goes well with baby roasted potatoes and grilled asparagus. The marinade is also great with pork chops or rich meaty fish like salmon, halibut, tuna, and swordfish of course.

- 1 cup / 250 ml dark soy sauce.
- 1 tsp / 5 ml toasted sesame oil.
- 2 cloves of fresh garlic finely minced.
- 1 Tbls. / 15 ml finely chopped or grated fresh ginger.
- Freshly ground black pepper to taste.
- Juice of half a lemon (1/4 cup) 50 ml Chinese rice cooking wine.
- 1 Tbls. / 15 ml tapioca starch (cornstarch will also do).
- 4 well marinated rib steaks (or better) about 1 ¹/₂" thick (4 cm)

Mix the soy sauce, sesame oil, garlic, ginger, lemon juice (or cooking wine) and tapioca starch in a nonreactive baking dish. Add the meat, turn to coat, and marinate for 10 minutes to $\frac{1}{2}$ hour turning once or twice. Do not marinate overnight as this is a fairly salty marinade.

Prepare your grill for medium direct heat. Place the steaks on the grill and cook for about 4 minutes. Turn the steaks and spoon a little marinate on top. Cook for another 4 minutes for medium rare. Let them rest for about 4 minutes and serve.

Hope you try this and enjoy it to the max. Let us know how you liked it and swap for a favorite recipe of your own.

Why Does Flat Tappet Need High Zinc Oil?

ii) Castrol GTX Classic Conventional Motor Oil



Where did the term "Fit the bill" (just right) come from?



HENRY FORD: REMEMBERING THE LEGEND OF THE AUTOMOBILE INDUSTRY

The Quadricycle



After Henry Ford got married, he was hired by the Edison Illuminating Company where he quickly rose through the company's ranks. In two years Henry had become the chief engineer.

This job had grueling hours as he was on call 24/7, but Ford found time to work on his own projects during downtimes. He was working to build a horseless carriage powered by a gasoline engine, or an automobile. Ford wasn't the first to think of this concept, but utilizing his engineering skill he designed a vehicle he named

the Quadricycle. This vehicle was a light metal frame that rode on 4 bicycle wheels.

Powering the horseless carriage was a two-cylinder gasoline engine with a whopping 4 horsepower. At the end of the day though, the stats of the vehicle didn't matter – it worked.
