



This famous Grand Prix car racing driver was named Mariette Hélène Delangle. Hellé Nice was her stage name while she performed as a dancer in cabarets around Europe. Unfortunately, her dancing career ended in 1928 after a skiing accident and Nice dived into professional car racing winning an all-female Grand Prix race at Autodrome de Montlhéry in 1929. Nice is also known as "The Bugatti Queen" since she joined Ettore Bugatti's team of racing drivers in 1931 being the only female on the Grand Prix circuit for several years.

Georges Paulin One of the best auto designers of all time

Georges Paulin was much more than a revered hero of the French Resistance during the Second World War — he was a praised automobile designer who gave rise to many of the country's most iconic platforms. In 1934, Paulin began his tenure at Marcel Pourtout, a French coachbuilder that became known for designs like the Delage D8, Talbot-Lago, Panhard coupe, and the Darl'mat Peugeot roadsters used in 1937 and 1938's Le <u>Mans</u>. Aside from creating some of the greatest automotive designs to come out of the country, he was also a part of the team that created the Eclipse roof, the first <u>retractable hardtop</u> that was power-operated. From 1938 to 1939, Paulin worked under the umbrella of Rolls-Royce-Bentley and was attributed with the creation of the legendary manufacturer's Corniche 1 and Comet Competition.

How Do I Identify a Ford 9-Inch Rear?


Ford 9 inch rear end identification is easy and can be accomplished with nothing more than a deep socket as a "go-no-go" gauge for the bottom two retaining nuts on the center section. If the socket fits (as shown in our photo below) it is a Ford 8-inch housing. The 9inch housing's center section will not allow the socket to clear, and you must remove the two bottom retaining nuts with a boxed end wrench.



Checking A Ford Axle With a Deep Socket To Confirm If It Is a 8-Inch or 9-Inch


However, the critical aspects of the rear axle are the axle flanges and axle lengths. You must confirm the flange version to be able to order the correct drum brake backing plates, **disc brake conversion kit**, or even the axle's **bearing retainer**. Axle length is not always identical from side to side, as many 9-inch applications use an offset center, so you must measure the housing carefully to be able to order the proper **axles**.

Ford 9-Inch Rear End Axle Flange Identification

Measuring for your 9-inch axles requires a few basic measurements to be taken. While we do offer cut-to-fit axles, you still need to ensure you have the proper measurements to be within the cut-to-fit area of the axle's splines. Measuring from axle flange to axle flange (measurement A in the diagram below) will give you total axle housing width. Measuring from the outside of the axle flange to the centerline of the pinion gear/nut will give you the correct axle length required (B and C measurements below). Note that most, but not all, applications will usually have one axle longer than the other due to an offset center section, so don't just measure one side and assume the other is the same.

Automotive Batteries Explained-What's Best For You?



Ensuring You Use the Right Battery for Your Application

For many, an **automotive battery** is just another wear item like your tires. When it comes time to replace the battery in their vehicle, they use the specs in their owner's manual or perhaps the group size information listed on the current battery in the car. Just like their tires, they simply go with the current size on their vehicle for a replacement and move on

with their day.

This may work for the daily driver in your garage, but when it comes to building a hot rod, a race car, or updating your classic muscle car or truck, you really need to place more consideration on your battery needs. Just like these specialty rides roll on non-stock tire sizes, so too will your battery need most likely be far from stock as well. To that end, understanding battery sizing, capacity, and internal cell composition, along with your ride's electrical system demands, engine size, and even climate and storage situation and how they all affect your vehicle's battery is the best way to help choose the right SLI (starting, light, and ignition) battery for your vehicle's electrical system storage needs. What Battery Group Size Do I Need?

While there are many aspects of an automotive battery to consider, first and foremost is the battery's dimensions. The [Battery Council International] (https://batterycouncil.org) (BCI) provides a standardized battery group size in numeric or alphanumeric configuration for a specific set of battery dimensions, which include the length, width, and height of the battery and even the terminal location and type of terminal. These dimensions are provided to fit a specific battery tray size and battery location in an OEM application. For our use though these numbers are more helpful to determine just what battery may fit a custom location such as a frame mounted battery tray in a hot rod, or even underneath a seat or mounted in the trunk of your muscle car. See our car battery size chart below for dimensions on popular group sizes.



Measure your **battery mounting tray/box** and using the chart below you can determine what battery BCI group will work for your custom application. Keep in mind what terminals your **battery cables** are configured for or what terminals you would like to use for the best cable routing and clearance. Just because your GM muscle car may have come with a side terminal battery doesn't mean you can't use a top terminal battery when you move it to the trunk of your car. Typically, you will find top post terminals on group 24, 34, 35, 41, 42, 48, 51, and 65 batteries. Side posts are more prevalent on group 75, 78, 79, and 100 batteries and these use a standard 3/8-16 internal thread. If you are looking for a dual post configuration to run accessory wiring or **remote charging terminals** these are usually found on group 34/78 batteries.



The rise and fall of Ford in Russia

In the early 2000s, Ford was the most popular and sought-after car in Russia. What killed the U.S. manufacturer and made it flee the Russian market, leaving behind millions of invested dollars? The history of the iconic U.S. carmaker in Russia began at a time when most ordinary folk could not even dream of owning such a vehicle. Yet only four years after the company's founding, Ford opened an official branch in the Russian Empire in 1907.



These were not the most peaceful times for the world, and Russia in particular. The October Revolution was fast approaching, which, when it hit, swept away the old order and created an entirely new state in the shape of the USSR. Incredibly, not only did Ford not leave Russia after the revolution, it saw good prospects for doing business with the new Soviet government.



In 1930, the KIM Moscow Automobile Plant opened in the USSR, where assembly of the Ford A passenger car and Ford AA truck got underway.



In 1932, U.S. specialists were involved in the construction of an entirely new Soviet car plant, which soon became known as the Gorky Automobile Plant. The plant produced the legendary GAZ vehicles, built using Ford technology.



In 1936, this plant produced the GAZ M-1, built on the basis of the Ford B. Even during the Cold War, when relations between two new superpowers hit rock-bottom, Soviet car designers continued to work for many years from a manual written by a Ford employee.



However, the Americans were not the only ones with something to share. In the mid-1960s, Henry Ford Jr. himself flew to Moscow with the express purpose of purchasing a license to manufacture the Soviet ZIL-118 Yunost (Youth) microbus. This remarkable Soviet invention was noted for its striking design – a kind of bus/limousine hybrid. Unfortunately, Ford's negotiations with the Soviet government failed to yield results.



It wasn't long before Ford had to endure another "Russian revolution." This time around, the Communist superpower – closed and hostile to all things American – was supplanted by a liberal country that wanted quality cars. However, the economic climate in the 1990s was fraught with risk for foreign car companies looking to grab a slice of the new market.
